

BOARD REPORTS ASP STATE CHAIRMAN

July 8th, 2016

The ASP evaluations took place starting April 29 and ending May 20. Enrollment was 1921 students with 253 teachers participating; and 1736 students were evaluated. Each local association's evaluations were run very smoothly and effectively by their local chairpersons and, of course, those of you who volunteered to help evaluation day. Special thank you to our local association chairpersons: CMTA – Karen Miller; EAMTA – Janice Holladay, NCTM; EVMTA – Lara Holt, Debbie Saifi, NCTM, Barb Russell, NCTM; NAMTA – Marge Johnson; PMTA – Carol Hill, NCTM, Bobbi Stoutenburgh, NCTM; TMTA – Karen Van Sickle, Kassandra Weleck, NCTM. Sarah Elliott and Fran Kaspar, NCTM, made sure that our students had their awards and certificates on time! Thank you to all the adjudicators who shared your knowledge and expertise with our students. So many of you, our teachers, volunteered your time in helping the evaluations run smoothly.

In January of this year the following e-mail blast was sent to all members of ASMTA:

• Due to the increasing number of students using copies at the annual evaluations, ASP has taken steps to discourage this infraction of the copyright law. The following announcement is in effect.

All music must be from a published source. The teacher will receive a warning letter if music is not from a published source or is obviously reproduced. The second year this occurs, students of that teacher using unauthorized copied music will be given a Participant rating.

• In addition, there has been an increasing number of students who have been using arrangements and/or simplifications at our evaluations. This is not allowed as stated in the teachers' guide and the repertoire guide. The following announcement is in effect.

Compositions must be in the original key. Arrangements by the composer may be used. For the evaluations, no transcriptions or simplified arrangements are allowed at any level. If an arrangement or a simplification is performed, the teacher will receive a warning letter of the infraction of this policy. The second year this occurs, students of that teacher using arrangements or simplified music will be given a Participant rating.

These are not new requirements but an attempt to reinforce ASP requirements. The above statements were also announced on the Program Forms in Packet 1 on the ASMTA website in August 2015.

Our big news!!! There is a new "Teachers Reference Guide" which replaces the 2006 Repertoire Guide and the 2008 Teachers Guide. All evaluation information and repertoire information are now located in one place! There are changes and/or additions to the repertoire guide. Please be advised that the new 2016 Teachers Reference Guide went into effect June 16, 2016. This guide can be purchased from your local materials person (where you get your workbooks) or you can purchase and download a copy from the ASP online store on the ASMTA website. Please check the online store occasionally as other materials will be eventually available for purchase.

ASP evaluation information for the 2016-2017 season will be on the ASMTA website no later than July 31, 2016.
