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**Proposal Submission Deadline: April 12, 2019, 11:59 p.m.**

The 2019 ASMTA Conference planning committee is pleased to announce the Call for Research and Pedagogy Poster Sessions for the 2019 Arizona State Music Teachers Association Conference. We invite submissions from college students, researchers, and teaching professionals.

We seek a range of poster proposals topics related to tradition and innovation in music education, piano pedagogy, performance, and all related music disciplines. Selected presenters will prepare a poster with dimensions of approximately 30" x 40" that discusses the research and/or pedagogical topic. Research posters will remain on display in the atrium and surrounding hallways at Northern Arizona University for the duration of the conference. Selected poster presenters must also be available during the research poster session on Saturday, June 8, from 8:30–9:00 a.m. to discuss their posters with attendees.

Proposal Requirements:

- Exact title of proposed poster as it would appear in the program.
- 350–word (or less) abstract/poster description.
- 250–word (or less) biography.
- Description of supporting technology (if any), including audio-visual resources.
- Headshot for conference program. Color preferred; minimum 300 dpi.

Please note that proposals will not be accepted after the April 12 deadline. Selected presenters will be notified by Friday, April 26, 2019.
