It is with great pleasure, honor, and humility for me to succeed Dr. Radmila Stojanovic-Kiriluk as State Chair for the Independent Music Teachers Forum. With your guidance and support, I hope to build upon the programs Dr.

Stojanovic-Kiriluk has so diligently developed during her term and further elevate IMTF's role to be a valuable resource for all members, including the instrumental and voice teachers who may be a minority in number in ASMTA, but are every bit vital to our organization, our teaching community, and especially to the students we serve.

You may have already received my selfintroduction via email this past summer. However, many of you may still find me a stranger to the organization, I joined ASMTA in 1988 when I first moved to Arizona as a doctoral student at ASU. I was actively involved at all levels of the organization during the early 1990s. I have served as the Arizona Study Program Chair for EVMTA, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-President for ASMTA, as well as the Southwest Division Chair for the MTNA Wurlitzer-Collegiate Competitions. I was a member in both Central District (now Phoenix) MTA and East Valley MTA until I took a break from teaching to raise a family. Now that I'm empty-nested, I am ready to be more engaged with ASMTA again and hope to be of service to the organization and its members in my new role.

IMTF supports member teachers by providing ideas and resources in areas of, but not limited to, pedagogy and performance, student assessment programs, continuing teacher education, mentoring, professional networking, and business operations.

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### **Arizona Study Program**

Amid the many changes we have experienced in our teaching over the past months, we can rest assured that some things will remain the same: the Arizona Study Program evaluations will occur as scheduled in May 2021

Your ASP Committee is committed to the longevity of this program for both teachers and students. We do this on the shoulders of all those that have sacrificed both time and energy to make this program a reality for thousands of Arizona students each year.

Why is this important when our students are dealing with so many new changes in their personal and educational lives?

In early Spring when all the changes to our regular routines began to occur, I recall a teacher sharing with me that some students were choosing not to complete instruction for the spring semester because Study Program was canceled, and they felt "what is the point?"

This hit me hard as I reflected that the ASP evaluations are the culmination of the year's efforts for many students. To remove the reward removes the motivation for some. In turn, it affects teacher's incomes, professional interactions, and devalues the work that was done in preparation for an annual evaluation. That is why the ASP evaluations are vital to both teachers and students that need the predictability of curriculum pacing and musical goals. This program was founded on the need for student goals, and this need is more important than ever. We must move forward to define these objectives, despite the challenges we are experiencing presently.

Recently, I highlighted a quote in an article from *American Music Teacher* (August/September 2020) that greatly impacted me. Author Karen Thickstun, NCTM, wrote, "Children's brains are resilient. However, according to Lori Desautels, there are three conditions that the brain cannot handle-**chronic unpredictability**, isolation and physical/emotional restraint-and the pandemic heightens all three (Grieze 2020)".

We have little control over the requirements of social isolation and the physical/emotional restraint mentioned above, but we can affect the progress of chronic unpredictability with our students. How? As teachers and mentors, we put them on track to a regular curriculum that includes mastery and memorization of pieces from all style periods, we continue to teach theory concepts, we supplement their repertoire with technical exercises that make the advancing repertoire a realistic aim, and we continue to encourage them to set short term and long term goals as they work toward their ASP evaluations in the Spring. We need to let students know that some things stay the same, and lead them in defying this

"unpredictability" amid new methods. We have always volunteered to be mentors and examples to our students. We will continue this amid the changes.

Finally, consider the widespread ramifications of ASP going to an online format: students in remote areas that require lengthy travel to participate in ASP evaluations can now participate without the added burdens of travel time and expenses. In addition, we may easily forget that these evaluations are not offered in every state. Some teachers that have moved out of Arizona wish they could still participate. Now they can.

Encourage your students to prepare for the annual Arizona Study Program evaluation. Watch the videos on the ASMTA website in preparation for the online evaluations, check the MusiEblast for video resources, educate your students on preparing videos, reach out to your colleagues to share information, find a fellow teacher to share theory exam testing and grading, embrace the changes and learn all you can. Model confidence and positivity to your students as they prepare for the May evaluations. As a result, the online experience will benefit you as well as your students for the future.


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# **Local Associations**
