



I also worked closely with Debbie Dinkel, Kassandra Weleck, and Dr. Michelle Wachter on a formal ASMTA Board vote to adopt ABRSM, which the board approved, alongside RCM and ASP, as an assessment program for ASMTA. Additionally, State Certification Chair Melodie Acker and I will develop a structured program to provide concrete guidance and support for members seeking MTNA Certification, which we hope to unveil at the 2022 State Convention.

Greetings, Arizona Teachers! I hope you are off to a wonderful new school year and that your studios are full of beautiful music. I am excited for the addition of in-person events for our



students over the coming months, and look forward to live music performances once again, when possible. Despite the need for strictly online evaluations for the Arizona Study Program in 2021, we still made great strides to provide a positive evaluation experience for participating students and teachers. In fact, we had 184 teachers enroll their students, and 1,482 students enrolled. We would like to thank our online adjudicators and valuable volunteers who made all this possible.

As we look ahead to the 2022 Arizona Study Program event, I would like to announce the ASP Committee's decision to conduct the upcoming ASP evaluations in person. In addition, we will also be offering an "Online Pilot Program" to continue building upon the online foundation that Susan Traylor worked so hard to put in place. The purpose of the "Pilot Program" is to offer teachers the online evaluation option, within the confines of a manageable enrollment base. In this way, the online option can be refined and streamlined so that it can support growing numbers each year in addition to the in- person option.

The number of students enrolled in the "Pilot Program" will be limited this year and can be accessed when students are enrolled for ASP online, like last year. There will be a required liability waiver required for those opting for the inperson evaluations, and this can be accessed on the ASMTA website, as well.

Please visit the ASMTA website under the Arizona Study Program tab to find all your ASP information in one place, including your Packet 1 information and enrollment information available on October 1. By making these changes, we are preserving the longevity of the Arizona Study Program for our future teachers and students. I wish you all a successful Fall semester!



Snezana succeeded in finding a beautiful, intimate Scottsdale location willing to host all of our 2021-22 General Meetings: The Piano Store (owned by Larry Bateman; located in The Pavilions at Talking Stick Shopping Center). Through January, all General Meetings are solidly scheduled to be held there. If Az Piano in Phoenix is able to provide parking for us in the months of February, March, and April, General Meetings in those months *may be* held there. (Presently parking is inadequate at Az Piano due to DOT construction.) If Az Piano is still not an option, The Piano Store is ready and waiting to further accommodate us!

On the subject of mitigation, the PMTA Board has decided that masks will be required at all General Meetings. For each inperson Student Event, there will be a statement on the registration form expressing that it is PMTA policy that all participating students, their families, and teachers are to faithfully adhere to all mitigation guidelines established by the event venue.

While most locations for both our student and teacher events are in place, we live knowing that online may become necessary. Our committees stand ready to adjust. PMTA's oldest and largest event is Piano Ensemble. This year is its 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary! At this point, the search is still on for a Piano Ensemble venue. In addition to working to procure a location, this clever and adaptable committee is in the process of designing an alternate version of Ensemble that will be *mostly* virtual. More details will come as this plan evolves!

A couple of wonderful developments in terms of Student Event locations have materialized. Grand Canyon University has offered to host our Student Recital Series free of charge! PMTA has previously paid \$100 per Student Recital at various piano store locations. Another amazing surprise is that we have found a new location to replace Paradise Valley Mall, our longtime Eastside location for Music at the Mall: Fashion Square Mall! Fashion Square is a very classy venue and has eagerly agreed to host this festive, day-long event in December!

As far as upcoming Student Events go, our first Student Recital (in person at GCU with an option for online participants to be broadcast on a screen in real time) is September 25, and Fall Festival (in person at Glendale Community College) is October 29-31.

Upcoming teacher events are Sharing Plus on September 23 (online; ASP guidelines and resources will be discussed) and Performance Plus on October 7 (home of Bobbi Stoutenburgh; teacher performances).

Our yearbook/website is still in process as some dates and locations of events are TBD. PMTA is joyfully and energetically poised for the new year!

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
