ASMTA Conference Report

The 2022 ASMTA Conference was a complete success! Over 80 people attended during the 3-day event. With 24 presenters, 28 educational sessions, and 8 great vendors, there was plenty to see, hear and learn. Our special guest artist, Charlie Albright, brought great insight with his presentation, connected with students during the masterclass and wowed us with his absolutely dazzling performance.

The Awards Gala, set with an old west theme and BBQ menu, was well attended and fun. The entertainment by Mariachi Aztlan de Pueblo High School was amazing; they did an awesome job of creating a festive mood. Gary Ingle, CEO of MTNA, spoke about the wonderful role we have as music teachers in the lives of our students, as music has a lasting impact long after they have grown up and moved on. Ken Noble was recognized as a new Lifetime Member and Natalya Thran as the Honored Teacher of the Year. We also recognized each local association's Member of the Year. It was a special moment, celebrating the enormous educational contributions of so many of our members.

Friday morning was highlighted by a student masterclass with Charlie Albright. The four students played wonderfully. After a great afternoon of educational sessions it was on to the main event with a concert by Charlie Albright. With no volunteers, Debbie herself stepped up, playing the melody of Twinkle, Twinkle while Charlie improvised around her. It was a uniquely spontaneous and joyful concert!

Saturday continued with the added excitement of the Honors Recital Finals competition. We continued our educational conference sessions while students lined the halls getting ready to compete. The silent auction had many great items and everything was sold and collected, hopefully raising some much needed funds for ASMTA. Closing out the day was the Honors Recital Winners Concert which included harps and some incredibly talented young performers playing to a packed hall.

We hope you were able to attend at least some of this conference as it is always fun to get together to make and experience music. If you weren't able to attend, we hope that next year you will plan to get in on the fun and attend the ASMTA Conference 2023. See you around the state!

What a busy year for the Arizona Study Program evaluations! The return to in person events after the past 2 years of online evaluations kept us on our toes and adjusting to pre pandemic protocols. What a joy to see students,



teachers, and our master adjudicators face to face once again. The evaluation results for 2022 include 195 participating teachers, 1515 students enrolled, 1319 students evaluated, 1031 students passing with a Superior rating, and 106 students scoring 100% on the Theory exam. We are so proud of our Arizona students!

Dear ASMTA members,

We had so many activities and great participation of our teachers and students in the Spring semester. Here are some of the things we did since the last report:

<u>Workshops</u>

In January, we hosted a Zoom workshop, "Diagnose This: Strategies in Solving Technical Problems in Repertoire" with Dr. Frank Huang from Florida. This presentation explored how to use creative practice approaches and methods in resolving some of the most common technical issues in repertoire. In February, Dr. Stuart Foster hosted a fun, in-person lecture, "Classical Music Can Be Seriously Funny" and presented how humor is celebrated in classical instrumental music. Our last workshop of the year was "Etude Gems of the Intermediate Piano Repertoire," given by the fantastic Mary Beth Shaffer. She explored a variety of engaging studies from the early to late intermediate piano repertoire, and their benefits.

Competitions

We had a greater-than-expected number of students for the traditional <u>EVMTA Piano Competition</u> on March 5, with close to 80 participants. Due to the large number of students, we had to hire two additional sets of adjudicators to cover everything in one day. We are considering preliminary rounds for next year in case we receive a large number of participants.

Our second competition, <u>Jason Sipe Piano Prize</u> <u>Performers Competition</u>, sponsored by AZ Piano owner, took place in a different location, at Metropolitan Youth Symphony Hall due to construction work at AZ Piano. Jason brought a grand Kawai for our students to play. The competition was a great success. The competition was held on April 9th.

We had two wonderful recitals in the Spring: Spring Recital, on March 26 and Seniors recital on April 16, where five seniors received monetary awards based on their activities in EVMTA.
