The 2024 Conference theme is "Teaching Artistry," with a focus on all elements related to the art of music pedagogy and artistic performance practice. Conference Highlights

The Conference artist will be **Alon Goldstein**, a pianist with an impressive performing and teaching career, former student of Leon Fleisher, who currently holds the position of Jack Strandberg/Missouri Endowed Chair in Piano at the UMKC Conservatory. Goldstein will perform a recital the evening of Friday, May 31st, teach a masterclass, and tentatively deliver a session on career development for young pianists.

The national representative to the Conference will be MTNA President **Peter Mack**, who will attend the conference on Thursday, May 30th, to deliver the keynote address at the beginning of the Conference and official remarks during the evening banquet.

This year's Conference also presents celebrated composer and teacher **Catherine Rollin** as the commissioned composer. Rollin will compose a new ASMTA-commissioned pedagogical piece that will be premiered at the Conference. She will also deliver a presentation on musical intuition and expression. ASP had a financial review conducted in March 2023 by Kris Curtis, PTP, KHM Bookworks, LLC. Ms. Curtis reviewed ASP Bookkeeping, Quick Books, and Treasurer procedures. Notable were her recommendations to perform monthly reconciliations and obtain approval from local or state chairs on all disbursement requests.

The issue of fixing or replacing the ASP Access Database is still unresolved but being addressed. Susan Traylor has been in contact with TenutoWeb, a competition registration and scheduling system designed for music teacher associations and non profits. The web designer is currently looking at our ASP Access database to determine the cost and work needed to make the improvements.


ASP awarded Rebecca Ong the Arnold Bullock Award in the amount of \$400.
